Updates from the Advising Team

Welcome back to our Coordinated Care newsletter! Here are some important updates:

Coursework and Financial Aid Eligibility

On a quarterly basis, the Financial Aid Office checks that the classes students take are part of their program. If a class doesn't count toward their program, they cannot receive federal or state financial aid for it.

Students are alerted via email if they are enrolled in a course that is ineligible for financial aid. They are also being encouraged to check in frequently with their advisors to ensure their courses fall within their degree requirements.

Directed Self-Placement for Math

Beginning Fall 2025, the LCC Testing Center launched the Directed Self-Placement (DSP) for math placement.

Rather than solving math problems, students self-assess their comfort level with different types of math concepts.

It Was a Busy Summer for Advising & One-Stop!

Our Advising team was hard at work over the summer, helping students prepare for Summer and Fall 2025. Between the two weeks before priority registration and the first Friday of fall quarter, advisors completed **2,225** appointments with **1,157** unique students. Including **678** new students starting their Red Devil journey.

During the Summer/Fall enrollment push, our One-Stop team connected with **1,915** students across **4,833** drop-in appointments. From assisting with financial aid and registration to helping new students navigate their first steps, their dedication helped hundreds of students stay on track through one of the most demanding times of the year.




Meet Our New Career Pathway Advisor: Jenna Burnell

Faculty Advisor Spotlight: *Ashley Cahill*


What drew you to your discipline originally, and what do you enjoy about it now?


How has faculty advising changed since you began advising?




What do you wish more students knew about your program or pathway?

Have You Heard About LCC's New Programs?



Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (BSCS)

The Bachelor of Science Computer Science (BSCS) degree prepares students for professions in software engineering, cybersecurity, data analysis, network administration, and more!



The BSCS is a full four-year program, meaning that students do not need any prior credits and do not need to apply for admission to the program.

There are both full-time and part-time pathways available. Although the core classes involve face-to-face instruction, some general education coursework is available online.

So far, we have 28 students currently enrolled in the CSBS program!

Automation, Instrumentation, & Robotics Associate in Applied Science (AAS)

The Automation, Instrumentation, & Robotics Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree prepares students for technician roles in manufacturing, energy, logistics, and more.

This two-year program emphasizes hands-on training to prepare students to optimize and maintain complex industrial systems..

Some main areas of focus include machine maintenance, hydraulics, instrumentation, industrial safety, and process control.


