The Curriculum Committee met Wednesday, April 18, at 3 p.m. in LIB 103 conference room.

The meeting was called to order by Robert Rodger at 3:05. It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda as written with three addendum items. Motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as corrected from the April 11 meeting.

Proposals from Karen Kearcher to revise prerequisites on:

- 1. NURS 241 Safe, Effective Care Environment, 3 credits/33 lecture
- 2. NURS 242 **Health Throughout the Lifespan,** 3 credits/33 lecture Effective Fall 2007
- 3. NURS 243 Behavioral Health, 3 credits/33 lecture
- 4. NURS 244 Physiologic Health I, 3 credits/33 lecture

The wording "or concurrent enrollment." shall be added to the existing prerequisite on each of the above course plans.

Betty Vickrey made a motion to approve. David McCarthy seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Proposal from Helen Kuebel, presented by Karen Kearcher, to delete the following:

5. **Nursing AAS**

Delete requirements of AH 110 and AH 230 which have been replaced by AH 101, 102, 131 and 132. Delete NURS 224 which has been replaced with NURS 223.

6. Nursing, Practical Nurse Level COP

Delete requirements of AH 110 and AH 230 which have been replaced by AH 101, 102, 131 and 132.

Addendum Item to Delete: **AH 110, Employment Issues in Health Care**, 1 credit/11 lecture **AH 230, Management Issues in Health Care**, 1 credit/11 lecture

These courses were implemented one year ago as part of the HOC program. The courses have been gradually phased out and have now been replaced by AH 101, 102, 131 and 132.

Brendan Glaser made a motion to approve 5, 6 and addendum as a block.

Jerry Clement seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Proposal from Kelley Smith to delete the following courses:

7. **PHED 135 Fitness Walking**, 1-2 credits/33-55 lab

PHED 153 Fitness For Life, 3 credits/22 lecture

PHED 172 Advanced Principles of Athletic Training, 3 credits/27.5 lecture/11 lab

PHED 184 Athletic Training Experience, 1 credit/22 lab

These courses have not been offered in many years and will not be offered in the next year. However, the committee agreed the need for further clarification from Physical Education faculty before deleting. A motion was made and seconded to <u>suspend</u> rather than to <u>delete</u> since these courses are all established as transferable.

8. **SPCH 101 Introduction to Speech Communication**, 3 credits/33 lecture

Course is no longer offered. The Communication requirement for degrees now states SPCH 110 rather than SPCH 101.

Joel Schaaf made a motion to approve. Karen Kearcher seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Effective Summer 2007.

Proposal from Trudy Woods, presented by Robert Rodger, to revise the following courses:

9. **ART 242 Intermediate Ceramic Art, Pottery**, 3 credits/33 lab

ART 243 Advanced Ceramic Art, Pottery, 3 credits/66 lab

Prerequisite on both of these courses will now include the wording "with a grade of C or better".

Brendan Glaser made a motion to approve. Mark Bergeson seconded.

Motion passed unanimously.

Proposals from Joel Schaaf:

10. **ENGR 254 Mechanics of Materials**, 4 credits/44 lecture

Increase credits/lecture to **5 credits/55 lecture** to meet credit requirements for course in new AS-T MRP degrees. Revise enabling objectives to include enhanced alignment with state-wide CC practice.

11. **ENGR 261 Dynamics**, 4 credits/44 lecture

Increase credits/lecture to 5/credits/55 lecture to meet credit requirements for

course in new AS-T MRP degrees. Course as previously taught covered same material as other CC's @ 5 credits. Revise enabling objectives to reflect enhanced alignment with state-wide CC practice.

12. **BIOL 257 General Microbiology**, 5 credits/33 lecture/44 lab

Revise prerequisite by deleting BIOL 100 since that course no longer satisfies the prerequisite requirement.

Joel Schaaf made a motion to approve. David McCarthy seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Effective Fall 2007.

Proposal from Linda Cullom/Maggie Stuart, presented by David Rosi, to add the following new courses:

- 13. **BSAD 294** Career Success, 2 credits/22 lecture
- 14. ACCT 294 Career Success, 2 credits/22 lecture
- 15. **BTEC 294** Career Success, 2 credits/22 lecture

These courses will improve students' soft skills and facilitate the end-of-program assessment of helping students prepare for the job application process. They will also provide statistics for graduates in each discipline. The courses will be added to program planners later and will be shown as electives for one year to be taken during one of the last two quarters of the program.

Karen Kearcher made a motion to approve the new programs with amendments to the AAS requirements. Joel Schaaf seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Effective Fall 2007.

Addendum item presented by David Rosi:

On behalf of the BTEC department course listings for BSAD (new BUS) and CIS (new CS) were given as handouts to committee members showing cross-referencing between LCC current course numbers and new course numbers due to the Common Course Numbering project.

Brendan made a motion to approve due to the impact this project has on LCC. Jerry Clement seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Proposal from Ann Williamson/Colleen Lemhouse, presented by Robert Rodger, to add new program:

18. Early Childhood Education AAS-T

Modeled after Early Childhood AAS-T degree offered by Centralia CC. The degree checklist was taken from City U. showing how our courses would fit. There continues to be new degree requirements. A degreed staff is the criteria considered for funding. SPCH 110 is listed as a 5-credit Humanities requirement consistent with the ICRC and the Major Ready Programs project.

Harry Blair made a motion to approve with amendments to the Curriculum Guide Math course numbers. David McCarthy seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Effective Summer 2007.

Proposal from Armando Herbelin, presented by Carl Roush, to revise the following courses:

Brendan Glaser made a motion to remove the Capstone requirement from the four DTA's and they will remain on the Plan B transfer. Karen Kearcher seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
