The Curriculum Committee met Wednesday, October 14, at 3 p.m. in LIB 103.

The meeting opened with welcome comments from chair, Kyle Hammon, and introduction of new members.

Instructional Curriculum Review

Kyle presented handouts entitled Curriculum Review Transfer Program and Curriculum Review Schedule. Both documents may be accessed by clicking on these links:

For the accreditation process all disciplines must be reviewed and addressed within two years time with the exception of Transitional Studies and Professional/Technical which operate on separate cycles and are so indicated on the Review Schedule. Special consideration shall be given to the seven questions listed on page five of the Review Transfer document. Findings shall be presented to the Curriculum Committee. Extra meetings may be scheduled to accommodate the influx of course plan updates.

Diversity Courses

Jon presented a handout showing the Diversity Task Team's recommendations of May 2009, to the Instructional Council. The recommendations were accepted and are now included as part of the consideration process when adding new or revising existing course plans. The new criteria applies to courses approved beginning fall, 2009. The Curriculum Committee shall develop a process to ensure courses on the current list align to the new criteria by the next catalog publication (two years). Members are directed to pages 11, 12 and 28 of the Curriculum Committee Handbook for further definition, list, and revised proposal form. Whether a course may be offered as an Intermittent Diversity Course remains under consideration. Areas of concern include:

- Course may not be offered as Diversity every quarter
- Course description and Outcomes would be different with each instructor
- Difficult to implement
- How to provide documentation to be recognized by a transfer institution
- How to list in the catalog

1. New Diversity **ENGL 280,** Multicultural Literature, 5 cr, 55 lec Course

Discussion:

Course number is in 200-level due to writing requirement and ENGL& 101 is a prerequisite. Course will be on the distribution list as a Humanity and meets all Diversity criteria. Assessment methods will be listed as: papers, study questions, and discussion. Gen Ed Outcomes will also reflect Communication. Minor revisions were made to Course Outcomes.

Proposal by Jon Kerr for Darcy Smith:

2. New Course WFC 099, Integrated College Experience, 1-12 cr,11-132 lec

Discussion:

Course is an introduction to college - first year experience. Offered 52 weeks in 12 week cycles (12 modules). Credit level depends on what week a student enters the program. Course is a new State mandated WorkFirst class that all community colleges receiving WorkFirst funds must have in place to service WorkFirst eligible students beginning Fall 2009. This course does not impact a degree and will grading will be A-F. Revise wording in Course Outcomes by replacing "acquire" with "demonstrate".

Transitional Studies is not considered a "department"; no department chair - Course oversight should be conducted by full-time faculty -

Original course number 231 suggested course was part of a series and subsequently changed to 230. Gen Ed Outcomes will reflect Communication. Course will be on the Restricted List.
