4. Dennis Shaw Anthropology

## Discussion:

Course plans have been determined as adequate. ANTH 206 has been carried forward on the Diversity List but needs to be updated/rewritten to meet revised standards. The rewritten course would be entitled "The Anthropology of Cultural Diversity" with content focusing upon the cultural pluralism of race, ethnicity, class, gender and religion in the US. Action items to be added to the report will include: Review of course plans - completed; Resources (i.e. databases, etc.) are adequate. The last sentence of the review is modified: Despite the absence of general campus recognition The discipline of anthropology is providing a crucial service to our students and preparing for future academic success.

5. Karen Joiner Allied Health and Nursing

## **Discussion:**

All course plans have been reviewed and updated by the department chair and all faculty. Outcomes are now more clearly communicated/defined. As stated in their Action Plan, staff are systematically reviewing the program for NLNAC accreditation which will occur in Fall 2014. Intended outcomes will be placed in the Nursing Program Handbook and the Office of Instruction will be adding these outcomes to the program planners. The Action Plan will be amended to include: Construction of the new Health Sciences building will address the need for additional classrooms; Outcomes will be added to the Program Planners; MLA and APA styles will be supported by Library Services with materials and tutorials.

## Discussion:

These courses are on the Diversity List but are now updated in hopes of meeting criteria of the new Diversity requirements. These courses include the culture of Latin America and Spain, as well as some aspects of the Spanish-speaking culture of the US (language, geography, history and traditions). Goals to be met include comprehending the role that cultural diversity plays in the complexity of society, and developing intercultural communication skills to communicate more effectively across the lines of cultural differences. Louisa presented sections of text from each chapter showing outcomes and assessment methods used while photocopies of all exams provided specific evidence. The classes are face-to-face and online with students being required to use the Supersite.

- Q) What is the focus the spirit of the class? Language mechanics rather than customs or cultural?
- A) Approx 80% language and 20% culture. It is more "about" Diversity rather than "touching" Diversity.
- Q) Do course outcomes reflect one or more Diversity goals?
- A) Three or four.
- Q) Is this contextualized or integrated enough to meet the Diversity requirements?
- A) Cultural relations of the Latin American countries need to be in the description as well as the outcomes.

However, these are "common" courses and significant changes to the descriptions would not be permitted. The letter D will not appear in the course number but :DIV will be part of the course title. It should be the document that makes it a Diversity course regardless of who teaches it. These courses cover all material used at other schools. Students transferring in to 123 would find the course provides some rigor since the courses are cumulative. Typically two years of high school Spanish would be suitable to transfer in at 122 but even then there may be a variance in how these are taught from school to school. Lynn reviews transfer students on a case-by-case analysis of their individual skills. Outcomes and Assessment Methods are to be amended by Louisa with Joan's assistance.
