Rationale: This course will promote a comprehension of the varied expressions of race and ethnic identity and the impact this has upon human societies. Central to this analysis will be a crucial understanding of the role that racial and ethnic affiliation plays in the structure of many human societies and how it influences the economic, political, social and cultural patterns of our behavior. Another 200 level (more specific to the topic) course was needed at LCC. No prereqs but basic essay skills are necessary. The Diversity proposal form shall be amended to reflect meeting criteria 1A (multicultural experience in the US) and 1C (history, culture, or religion of non-European civilizations such as Asia, Africa, or Latin America).

Rationale: BTEC 113 has had very low enrollment over the last five years. Some objectives from this course have been added to BTEC 260. Desktop publishing objectives can be met by adding BTEC 147 Desktop Publishing course that is offered every quarter in the BTEC lab. This change is shown in the revision to the AAS - deleting BTEC 113 (5 cr), add BTEC 147 (3 cr), add 1 credit of elective study.

ENGL 100 will better equip students to understand and communicate their understanding of the course outcomes. These changes support the program.

(revise title, credit and lecture hours, add to Social Science			
distribution list, update outcomes and assessment methods)			

Rationale: The field of chemical dependency has grown and the amount of information and research makes it difficult to teach the subject within 3 credits. CDS 101 is now part of the DTA and would be more suitable for transfer at 5 credits. These changes are in alignment with those of other WA state community colleges who have changed this to a 5 credit course. Revising the course title aligns with Distribution List requirements (course is similar to Introduction to Criminal Justice which is on the Social Science Distribution List). The ICRC accepts Intro to Chemical Dependency courses as they have social implications. This particular course would be the 3<sup>rd</sup> social science option for NURS. Placing this course on the Social Science Distribution List is at the discretion of our own local judgment in addition to any ICRC guidelines. An outcome has been added to 'Identify and recognize recovery and support systems for chemical dependency'.

Rationale: Communications requirement of ENGL 100 is changed to ENGL& 101 providing a higher level of writing skills. Students are required to write extensively. Computational requirement is updated from MATH 092 to read MATH 098/099, Program requirement of CDS 101 is changed from 3 to 5 credits and PSYC 220 (5 cr) is added as an option in the four-series selection list. Program Requirements now total 61-63 credits for a total of 92-95 credits.

Rationale: Currently LCC's nursing program offers an AAS, which is a 'terminal degree'. Employers in the state are moving toward, or have moved to, requiring a baccalaureate degree at the time of hire or within a stated amount of time. The Master Plan for Nursing Education in Washington recommends that students attain at least a BSN. The current AAS degrees will be deleted and replaced with AAS-T degrees. Additional courses will not be required. These degrees will now be presented to SBCTC for approval.
