The Course Proposal Form is now revised to include: List certificate, programs, and degrees that utilize this course. Attach program planners and the associated degree/certificate proposals.

Page 5 of the "Preparing Proposals" document shall now include: Research the use of the course in certificates, programs, or degrees. (Fran will assist with this process). If this course impacts a certificate, program, or degree, collaborate with those affected and jointly submit the program planner(s) and complete a degree/certificate proposal form for each.

## **Informational/Discussion Items:**

**INFO 1** – ECED& 100, Child Care Basics – course grading is changed from A-F letter grade to a Pass/Fail. It is a state required curriculum and students have to pass each module with an 80% or better to receive the certificate. Therefore, receiving a C does not have merit. No other changes.
