Opening remarks were made by Karen Joiner.

Informational Item:

1) ECE – AAS-T – Concordia University

Changes reflect the revisions Concordia University made to the existing articulation between Lower Columbia Early Childhood Education degree and Concordia University bachelor degree in Early Childhood Education. Total credits 94-97. *Effective Fall 2015*

A. revise course ENGL 098, College-Ready English I 5 cr, 55 lec

Rationale: Objectives are updated and aligned with current practice. COLL 101/102 are added as co-requisites.

B. revise course ENGL 099, College-Ready English II 5 cr, 55 lec

Rationale: Prerequisite and co-requisite changed to ensure required placement in COLL 101 and 102 for students who place into pre-college English. Outcomes are updated to realign with curriculum.

Resolution: David Rosi made a motion to approve; Nicole seconded. Motion carried.

Proposal from Nicole DiGerlando:

C. revise course ENGL 110, Industrial Communications 5 cr, 55 lec (prerequisite)

Rationale: Prerequisite is added (had been "none") to provide consistency in the prerequisites for college-level English. Prerequisite will read: ENGL 099 with a grade of C or higher. Global Skills will reflect Interpersonal Relations.

Resolution: David Rosi made a motion to approve with suggested amendments to prerequisite, Global Skills, and Outcomes.

Courtney seconded. Motion carried.

Proposals from Mark Gaither: D. new certificate Community, Health, & Wellness Advocate-COP 52-60 total credits Rationale: Community Health Workers (CHW), as defined by the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, assists individuals and communities in adopting healthy behaviors. This includes, but is not limited to, providing social support, connecting people and services, advocating for wellness, supporting community services that improve lives, and assisting individuals with managing health and wellness needs. Locally, regionally, and throughout the state, health and wellness organizations, collaborations, community groups, and professionals have identified CHWs as a resource to improve individual and community health and wellness. As identified by the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, demand for CHWs as part of the health and wellness workforce is Resolution: Dave Cordero made a motion to approve with an increase in total credits from 52-56 to 52-60 (to accommodate electives from specific disciplines listed on the program planner); David Rosi seconded. Motion carried. Effective: Fall 2015 **E.** revise course BTEC 165, Cultural Awareness for Care Professionals 3 cr, 33 lec (was 2 cr, $\overline{22 \text{ lec}}$) (cr, lec, diversity consideration) Rationale: The change in credits is precipitated on student suggestions during the past year, indicating that the course needs to be expanded, specifically in the amount of time devoted to group discussions. Consequently faculty believe it is necessary to expand the course from the current 2 credit lecture in a hybrid format to a 3 credit lecture hybrid format. Specifically, this would include the increase of research activities and group discussions. The current group discussion would expand from 1 hour per week to 1.5 hours per week. This is the typical amount of time the class has "run over" each quarter. For the Diversity content, this course explores the cultural disparities in healthcare: a) examines cultural and linguistic differences which limit the access to healthcare or prevent the adoption of health promoting of harm-reducing behaviors, b) presents effective crosscultural communication through the use of relevant languages, respectful attitudes, and cultural knowledge, c) provides strategies to apply cultural awareness skills in all aspects of work with clients, families, community members, and colleagues. Resolution: Course will be approved as a 3-cr course – but will be tabled as a Diversity consideration until clarification is received from Instructional Council (next meeting June 09). David Rosi made a motion to approve; Kyle seconded. Motion carried. Effective: Fall 2015 **Proposals from David Rosi: F.** revise degree **Information Tech Systems-AAS** 92-100 total credits **G.** revise degree **Information Tech Systems – AAS-T** 92-100 total credits Rationale: We are no longer offering the Forensics courses which are offered on the degrees This request removes them from the degree as an option. They are an elective group of courses and removing them will not affect student completion. Currently the website and catalog lists them and students have been wanting to take the courses which we do not offer. To clearly advertise what we offer, we need to remove these courses from these degrees. **H.** retire certificate **Digital Forensics – COC** 18 total credits (no longer offer Forensics courses) Rationale: We are no longer offering the Forensics courses which are offered on this certificate. This request retires the Resolution: Forensics courses will be deleted/retired at a later date. Courtney made a motion to approve; Dave Cordero seconded. Motion carried. Effective: Fall 2015 **Proposals from Tamara Norton: I.** retire degree RN-LPN2RN-Campus Based – AAS-T 122-124 total credits Rationale: The nursing program is requesting deletion of the LPN2RN Campus-Based Program Option. LPNs who wish to enter the program to complete an associate degree in nursing will still be able to "opt in" to NURS 201, space available, if they meet the admission requirements as for PN's (pass TEAS, pass LPN assessment, have current license as PN in Washington or Oregon, all pre-requisite and supportive course work completed with a C or higher). This simplifies our systematic evaluation plan in nursing, as we would no longer have to offer this as a separate program option. Resolution: David Rosi made a motion to approve; Courtney seconded. Motion carried. Effective: Fall 2015 **J.** retire degree **RN-RONE** – **AAS-T** (Rural Outreach Nursing Education) 124 total credits Rationale: LCC has made the decision to suspend the RONE option at this time, due to declining interest from students as well as a lack of interest/commitment from partnering critical access hospitals. Resolution: David Rosi made a motion to approve; Darlene seconded. Motion carried. Effective: Fall 2015 **Proposal from Karen Joiner: K.** new course XXXX 299, Independent Study 1-10 cr variable

Rationale: Provides a generic and non-specific course plan for independent study courses.

P. degrees/certificates | Clarify and simplify MATH prerequisites for various prof/tech degrees and certificates

Rationale: No prerequisites have been added, nor have any actually been dropped. MATH 106 has a prerequisite of MATH 079 or TECH 079 and Prof/Tech students generally then go right into MATH 106. Very few will take the MATH 088/089 sequence. The "or higher" designation has proven to be confusing for students and sometimes advisers, i.e. some students believe that MATH 105 will suffice.
