INFO 1 – BIOL& 160 – General Biology w/Lab: Cell/Molecular: Extended title has been approved on the common course request from the October 14, 2020 meeting.

INFO 2 – BTEC 110 – Keyboarding Speed and Accuracy I: Revised from P/F to graded course to be included in GPA calculations.

B.	Revise Program	Medical Assisting AAS	90-93 cr total

Rationale: "Substitution Proposals: All may appeal to pre-NURS students that want/need a plan B. These are ways for MEDA to accept more of their pre-NURS credits. We have already seen this benefit a significant number of these students.

NOTE: These substitutions would not jeopardize student success in learning outcomes required for specialized (CAAHEP) accreditation of the Medical Assisting Program. Teaching, learning, and assessment of these outcomes is covered in other cohort required courses.

PSYC& 200 (5 credits, Lifespan Psychology) for AH 114 (2 credits, Healthcare Communication Skills)... for both COP & AAS

AH 114 (2 credits) is a prerequisite for entering the MEDA cohort (both COP & AAS). PSYC& 200 (5 credits) is a prerequisite for acceptance to a NURS cohort. With Guided Pathways there may come a time that AH 114 is not required, but PSYC& 200 is a common course for an allied health meta major.

Any college-level MATH (5 credits) for MATH 105 (5 credits, Math for Health Sciences)... for both COP & AAS Success in any college-level math course prepares a student for the math-related competencies/objectives required for medical assisting.

Resolution: Courtney made a motion to approve, Tamara seconded. Motion carried.

CMST& 220 (5 credits, Public Speaking) for ENGL& 102 (5 credits, English Composition II)... for AAS Nursing allows CMST& 220 as an alternative to ENGL& 102, and many students choose this option. Why not offer the same option for the AAS in Medical Assisting.
