Meeting Commencement:

Opening remarks were made by Merry Bond. Magnus Altmayer announced that he and Rosemary are available to review and discuss proposals before submitting them to the Curriculum Committee. Tamra also mentioned that proposals do not have to wait until the fall meetings. She recommended submitting sooner, rather than later.

Information Items:

INFO 1 – BTEC 111 and 112 prerequisites: Cleanup. BTEC 111 and 112 prerequisites will replace the "or concurrent enrollment in BTEC 105" with "or concurrent enrollment in BTEC 110", as BTEC 105 no longer exists.

INFO 2 – Course Terms Offered Change: MATH 105, Mathematics for Healthcare Applications. Change terms offered to Winter and Spring.

INFO 3 – HIST& 127 description: To align with recent changes to other history courses, we're removing "(1500-1800)" from the course description.

A) Diversity Course	SPAN& 221, Spanish IV:DIV (diversity)	5 cr, 55 lec
B) Diversity Course	SPAN& 222, Spanish V:DIV (diversity)	5 cr, 55 lec
C) Diversity Course	SPAN& 223, Spanish VI:DIV (diversity)	5 cr, 55 lec

Rationale: The foundation of these courses is the development of communicative competence in Spanish, the second most widely spoken language in the United States. Language is presented as an evolving human practice shaped by culture and community. Students learn to use the language in culturally appropriate and respectful ways, with attention to both global Spanish-speaking contexts and their corresponding diaspora communities in the United States (e.g., Mexican American communities).

D) Revise Degree	Health and Fitness Focus AA-DTA (courses)	90 cr total
