Minutes:

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the February meeting as written. The minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.

Old Business:

Review of Degree Requirements:

- Discussion on the Capstone Requirement continued from the February meeting.
- ❖ Laura went around the table asking for input from each department.
 - The majority reported that their departments believed in the philosophy of the Capstone requirement. Some of the comments and concerns expressed included
 - Capstone students included in regular classes
 - Not enough Capstone offerings each quarter
 - Capstone has moved away from the original intent.
 - Not always consistent across the disciplines
 - Writing intensive class might be the best we can do considering our size and budget
 - Is the original intent still of enough value to pursue should we take another path
 - Is there another structure that might work better
 - Cornerstone to Capstone what would be an integrative approach to experience information literacy
 - Would requiring a portfolio of student work be an option
 - "W" (writing intensive) classes or "R" (research intensive) classes be an option
 - Continue the mixed classes with Capstone students meeting an extra day
 - Writing intensive course might not be best option for all disciplines
 - Imbed research into current courses or offer a linked one or two credit course—research papers do not need to be 12 pages—research can be done for smaller papers
 - If Capstone continues to be a requirement—we are obligated to offer enough classes
 - No real definition of Capstone in the catalog
- Laura suggested that Wendy develop a quick survey to be sent out to all faculty to get a sense of the general feeling on the Capstone requirement.
