## **Consent Items:**

• The following amendment was made to the June minutes:

• Lisa announced that three part-time technicians in IT will be moved to full-time for a *two* year period using student tech fees.

It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes as amended. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote.

#### **Discussion Items:**

- Exceptional Faculty Vote The ballots for Exceptional Faculty were distributed to all voting members of the council & were returned to Natalie by the end of the meeting.
- Advising Focus Team Karen Joiner provided background information on the Achieving the Dream advising focus team. The advising focus team is meeting weekly to review LCC's advising model and explore other models. The goal of this task force is to determine the most efficient & effective advising program which best suits LCC students, faculty, and staff. Students and faculty will be invited to participate in forums to provide input on advising, similar in format to the IT forums of last spring. November 13<sup>th</sup> has been declared ATD day, and forums will be available for participation. Faculty & staff are welcome to contact team members with questions and comments.

- **Digital Literacy Focus Team** Renee Carney provided a handout covering background information on the digital literacy task force. The first meeting of the task force will be held in Fall 2012. The goal of this task force is to conduct research to determine the most efficient and effective way of assessing & building digital literacy skills for all LCC students. Discussions were held on the process to establish digital literacy requirements for students. Faculty & staff are welcome to contact team members with questions and comments. Wendy Hall recommended including a Student Tutor to serve on the committee.

Discussions were held on the process & preliminary research that needs to occur prior to establishing what those courses will be. Discussions were held on previous & current courses/programs and their effect on completion rates. Work begins now on building our new courses for the years to come.
- Mentoring Program Laura shared information on the Mentoring program which is being overseen by Adam Wolfer. The purpose of the mentoring program is to increase student/faculty engagement. Adam will contact department chairs to begin the discussion about the details.
