Nicole shared a revised draft of the finals schedule based upon recommendations received at the April Instructional Council meeting. One last recommendation was made to include a statement that student requests for final schedule changes would need to be made by the end of the 8th week. Nicole will reflect this request on the new version and replace in the fall schedule.

New Business -

International Cultural Training - A discussion was held regarding training needs for faculty and staff to prepare for the arriving international students to the LCC campus. Melinda Weatherford is collecting training and resources which Grace will share in this week's edition of 'Grace Notes.' Two training topics of interest were expressed: 1) how to support students who arrive with a language barrier; 2) offer cultural awareness training for all faculty & staff. Questions and/or requests can be made to Grace or Natalie.

Fall In-Service schedule - A draft of the fall in-service schedule was shared with Instructional Council. The next step is to submit instruction's proposal to President's Cabinet for approval. The fall faculty day was set for Friday, September 19th based off a faculty preference survey. The council reviewed & shared recommendation on how to make the Assessment Day more effective, Brendan will share feedback received at the next Instructional Assessment meeting. Grace shared that the SCALE training would cost \$13,000 and is not an option financially for the upcoming fall in-service week. Brendan is coordinating a Professional & Technical Faculty training for Tuesday, more details to come.
