- **Title III Video “Rethinking Retention”** – This thought provoking two-hour video presentation was accompanied with booklets that were shared. - **Dan Johnson** – The student ID system hours for summer quarter are 9:00 am to 2:00 pm Monday through Thursday. There is a full contingent for 2004-05 student government positions.

 - **Curriculum Committee** – Therese Montoya provided many revisions and Julie Dasso had a pen quick enough to record the following:
 - CIS 180, 185, 280, 284, 285, 286, 211 revised to change lecture/lab hours
 - MATH 215 – deleted prerequisite of CIS 280
 - New course: CIS 100 – Computing Survival Skills
 - MATH 125 was added to the AA-DTA Business transfer degree for WSU as a required course in Natural Science category
 - ACCT 101, 150, 231, 232, 233, 241 updated the “V” designations and updated the enabling objectives in ACCT 233
 - New course: CIS 240 – Introduction to Network Security and is now required for all CIS Networking majors
 - Networking degree updated to change credits needed
 - HUMN 110 added to the Humanities distribution list
 - ITEC courses changed and ADT courses added (see Curriculum notes for extensive details)
 - AAS-T degrees added in: Microcomputer Network Specialist, Applications Programmer, Microcomputer Applications Specialist
 - Electives were changed for the following degrees: Diesel, CDS, ECED, BTEC

 - **Financial Aid Committee** – Alex Montoya reported that summer appeals will be heard June 28.
